

# Bible Study

## Quick recap

Michael, Jonathan, and Nate met to discuss Mark 10, focusing on the passages about marriage and divorce, and particularly the stories of Blind Bartimaeus and the Rich Young Ruler. Michael led the discussion, emphasizing how Blind Bartimaeus's desperate cry "Son of David, have mercy on me" represented true spiritual longing, while the Rich Young Ruler's comfortable religious life prevented him from fully following Jesus. The group explored themes of discipleship, spiritual blindness, and the cost of truly following Christ, with Michael sharing insights about how people in different circumstances approach faith, noting that those with fewer material possessions often demonstrate greater spiritual richness. The conversation concluded with a prayer asking for spiritual eyes to see God more clearly and the courage to fully follow Him.

## Summary

### Hospital Visit and Family Updates

Michael and Jonathan discussed Colleen being at the hospital, with Michael currently at the hospital chapel. ### Bible Study and Prayer Meeting

Michael shared that his wife was at the hospital expecting to give birth within the next 5-6 hours, and despite being awake for several hours without sleep, she reminded him about an upcoming 5:30 meeting. The group then began discussing Mark 10, and Michael led a prayer

asking for open hearts to understand the Bible's teachings and for guidance in interpreting the material.

## **Biblical Discipleship and Spiritual Transformation**

Michael discussed biblical passages from Mark 10, focusing on themes of discipleship, the cost of following Jesus, and spiritual blindness. He highlighted the contrast between the blind beggar who cried out to Jesus for mercy and received his sight, versus the rich young ruler who walked away when asked to sell his possessions. Michael emphasized that true discipleship requires complete surrender and willingness to "drink of the cup that I drink of," noting that many people attend church regularly but miss experiencing the full transformation described in the Bible.

## **Biblical Faith and Spiritual Need**

The group discussed the biblical story of Jesus healing Blind Bartimaeus compared to the encounter with the rich young ruler. Nate highlighted how Jesus intentionally chose this timing to demonstrate that true faith comes from a place of need rather than wealth or health. Michael reflected on how Americans often say they need to "make time for Jesus" but noted that the New Testament doesn't show people making time for Jesus in this way, as they were fully committed to following him. The discussion concluded with a prayer where they asked God to open their spiritual eyes to see him more clearly and follow him fully.
