

# Bible Study

## Quick recap

## Summary

### Mark 15 Bible Study Discussion

Michael discussed the distinction between religion and a genuine relationship with God, arguing that religion often leads to self-righteousness and does not produce true change. He referenced Philippians 3:8, emphasizing the importance of forsaking one's own righteousness to follow Jesus. The conversation highlighted how religious activities can deceive individuals into thinking they are right with God, while actually leading to sin due to a lack of humility.

## **Jesus's Trial and Execution Analysis**

Michael discussed the biblical story of Jesus's trial and execution, focusing on the Pharisees' rejection of Jesus due to their desire for their own righteousness. He expressed confusion about why people would be so invested in opposing someone they didn't believe in, comparing it to modern situations where individuals claim to be divine. Michael also highlighted Pilate's willingness to please the crowd rather than standing firm in his decisions, noting a pattern of cowardice among the characters involved in Jesus's trial.

## **Christian Suffering and Faith Witness**

Michael discussed the importance of taking up one's cross and sharing in Jesus's suffering, emphasizing that believers should not feel alone in their struggles. He referenced a quote from a book about people suffering more than Christ and highlighted how some are tortured for their faith. Michael compared modern Christians to the people who witnessed Jesus's crucifixion, noting that while many can quote biblical stories, their actions often contradict their beliefs.

## **Convenience vs Conviction in Faith**

Michael discussed the concept of choosing convenience over conviction, using the biblical story of Judas as an example. He referenced Nelson Mandela's quote about finding something worthy of dying for. Michael questioned whether people who know scripture but don't live according to its teachings are effectively rejecting Jesus, comparing it to how Jesus's opponents quoted scripture against him.

## **Jesus's Crucifixion and Biblical Women**

Michael and Jonathan discussed the biblical account of Jesus's crucifixion, focusing on how Jesus maintained his connection to scripture even in his suffering. Michael emphasized the remarkable nature of Jesus's response to persecution, contrasting it with human reactions to minor pain. The conversation also touched on the role of women in the biblical narrative and in contemporary faith communities, with Michael noting how women tend to be more in tune with their emotions and more likely to speak up about concerns.

## **Following God's Leadership Example**

Michael discussed how many women historically sought godly men to follow, drawing a parallel to Jesus's influence. He challenged the audience to consider if they are submitted to God in a way that would attract others to follow their lead. Michael concluded with a prayer, asking for guidance on how to live for eternity rather than temporary pleasures, and for revelation on what it means to be truly born again.
